EC Jesta Sidell is a seasoned public representative and a distinguished cadre of the ANC and the ANCWL respectively, with a commendable track record in governance, public administration, and legislative oversight. Currently serving as a Member of the Mpumalanga Provincial Legislature since 2024 and Member of the Executive Council responsible for Economic Development and Tourism since July 2025, MEC Jesta Sidell has demonstrated an unwavering commitment to the ideals of transformative governance, people-centred development, and social justice.

Her extensive experience in the local sphere of government is underpinned by her tenure as the Executive Mayor of Ehlanzeni District Municipality from 2016 until May 2024, where she championed integrated development planning, economic growth, and social cohesion. During her stewardship, Ehlanzeni District Municipality recorded strides in service delivery and institutional stability, reflecting her strategic leadership and developmental ethos and amongst other clean governance audit.

ollowing her appointment as the MEC for Economic Development and Tourism, Ms. Jesta Sidell delivered her maiden Policy and Budget Speech for Vote 6, before the Mpumalanga Provincial Legislature on 22 July 2025. In her Policy and Budget statement, the MEC provided a detailed account of the achievements of the Department and its Public Entities, during the financial year ended 3 I March 2025. The MEC further provided details of the work planned with concomitant funds for the financial year that commenced on 0 I April 2025.

The MEC used the tabling to thank the Premier, Mr. Mandla Ndlovu, and her political home, the African National Congress for entrusting her with the responsibility to lead economic development activities in the Province.

"It is indeed a humbling experience, and I commit without reservations, to serve the people of Mpumalanga – **the Place of the Rising Sun**, with a great sense of humility. I, therefore, stand before this august House, to re-assure our people that as the

Department, we remain committed to continue to address their aspirations", said MEC Sidell.

Budget Allocation (per Programme)

Programme 1:Administration will receive an amount of **131** million, **325** thousand rands in order to enable effective operational support to the programmes of the Department and Public Entities.

Programme 2: Integrated Economic Development will receive **385 million**, **764 thousand rands**. Included in this amount, is **270 million**, **600 thousand rands** to fund the requirements of MEGA, **3 million rands** for the Mpumalanga Tourism Youth Fund; and **38 million**, **53 thousand rands** to fund the Mpumalanga International Food Market (MIFM).

Programme 3:Trade and Sector Development will receive an amount of **97 million, 639 thousand rands**. Included in this amount, is 55 million, 451 thousand rands for the Nkomazi SEZ,

Included in this amount, is 55 million, 451 thousand rands for the Nkomazi SEZ, 2 million, 206 thousand rands for the Mpumalanga Stainless Steel Initiative, I million, 240 thousand rands for Furntech, and 10 million, 487 thousand rands for the Mpumalanga Green Cluster Agency.

Programme 4: Business Regulation and Governance will receive **167 million**, **461 thousand rands** which includes **139 million**, **304 thousand rands** to fund the requirements of the MER.

Programme 5: Economic Planning will receive **23 million**, **720 thousand rands**.

And lastly, **Programme 6**: Tourism is allocated **518 million**, **352 thousand rands**, which includes **499 million**, **461 thousand rands** to fund the requirements of the MTPA.

The total amount to be transferred by the Department to other entities, including its Public Entities, is **981 million**, **749 thousand rands**, which is 74% of the total budget of the Department.

The total allocation to fund the requirements of the Department (Vote 6), for the financial year ending March 2026 is **One billion, 324 million, 261 thousand rands**.

"This Policy and Budget statement that I have just tabled before this august house seeks to inspire hope and re-assure our people that as the Department, we remain committed to continue to address their aspirations, as clearly expressed in the Manifesto of the governing party in the Province", concluded Sidell.

s we honour women during this significant month, it is befitting to start our commentary by borrowing from the late former statesman and globally renowned freedom fighter, Nelson Mandela, who opined that "Freedom cannot be achieved unless the women have been emancipated from all forms of oppression." We also borrow from the late former President of Burkina Faso, Thomas Sankara, who posited that "There is no true social revolution without the liberation of women."

In their wisdom, both the former statesman reiterates and fully appreciate the irrefutable fact that women are the bedrock of communities and societies in general. Thus, we must also take a moment and pay tribute to all heroines like Charlotte Maxeke, Lilian Ngoyi, Helen Joseph, Sophia Williams-De Bruyn, Rahima Moosa, Madi Hall-Xuma, Dorothy Nyembe, Adelaide Tambo, Albertina Sisulu, and Winnie Madikizela-Mandela, to mention just a few.

We pay tribute to these freedom fighters because they challenged the status quo during a time when the social, political, and legislative landscape was defined by discriminatory norms and traditions. Therefore, during this month, we need to reflect and celebrate the inestimable role that women played in the struggle for the liberation and attainment of democracy in South Africa, Africa. It is a historical fact that women have contributed significantly to the advancement of the National Democratic Revolution and the process of building a united, democratic, non-racial, non-sexist and prosperous South Africa.

It was during this month of August, in 1956, that more than 20 thousand women staged a historic march to the Union buildings to protest against the extension of pass laws to women. Courageous women, from across the country, stood in silence for 30 minutes, and after they proceeded to sing the now famous revolutionary song: Wathint'abafazi Wathint'Imbokodo, Uza Kufa! In stark contrast to what the visionary forebears who wrote the Women's Charter 74 years ago, women in South Africa live in fear as they bear the worst poverty, economic exclusion, and unprecedented nightmare of gender-based violence and femicide.

Where we are, women do not live as equals to their male counterparts; women live in fear due to violent crimes and senseless gender-based violence. In the main, several aspects of gender-based violence and femicide are directly linked to the lack of women's empowerment.

While the government has introduced progressive legislation to deal with the scourge of gender-based violence, it remains stubbornly persistent in our communities. In acknowledging the historic and indispensable role that women played in the struggle for liberation and the consolidation of South Africa's democracy, the African National Congress (ANC)-led government has, since 1994, prioritised the advancement of women's rights as a cornerstone of our democratic project.





he MEC for Economic Development and Tourism Ms. Jesta Sidell, convened a meeting with the Kruger Lowveld Tourism, a division of the Kruger Lowveld Chamber of Business and Tourism (KLCBT) and the Mpumalanga Tourism and Parks Agency (MTPA), on Tuesday, 11 August 2025, to strengthen relations and foster collaboration. The meeting follows a number of concerns raised by the Kruger Lowveld Tourism around the unpalatable condition of some of the tourism sites under the management of MTPA, across the Panorama Route.

"I must indicate that we acknowledge the issues that have been raised and the challenges that are bedeviling our Public Entity, the MTPA, hence we have decided to convene this very important meeting to process the issues and find collective solutions to the challenges", explained MEC Sidell.

The discussions anchored on collaboration and coherent approach to reposition the Province as the ultimate tourism destination. Working with the private sector as a major stakeholder, the Department seeks to foster a meaningful tourism revitalization strategy for economic growth that contribute to the creation of the much-needed jobs and eradication of poverty.

"Tourism remains a priority sector in Mpumalanga, with much potential to create the much-needed jobs. Therefore, it is imperative that we convene meetings of this nature with key role players to come up with solid and coherent strategies geared towards elevating tourism in the Province", explained MFC Sidell

Met With MTPA And The K

To Strengthen Rela Foster Col The meeting served as a platform for open, solution-driven dialogue between government and the tourism sector. All stakeholders agreed that stronger collaboration is essential to resolve infrastructure challenges and to ensure Mpumalanga continues to attract both domestic and international tourists. The MTPA acknowledged the issues raised and confirmed that interventions are already underway to address infrastructure-related constraints. These efforts aim to restore and improve the state of tourism sites, ensuring that visitor experience is not compromised.

A significant outcome of the engagement was the joint decision to revive the Tourism **Think Tank** - a collaborative forum that previously facilitated dialogue and strategic alignment between government and the tourism industry. The forum will also engage on strategies to enhance the quality of the existing tourism offerings and explored opportunities to develop new tourism experience.

Despite the challenges, the meeting also acknowledged progress made in key areas such as tourism safety and victim support. The Tourism Safety Forum is now operational, resulting in a notable reduction in safety-related incidents. Where incidents do occur, response times are swift, and victim support is managed professionally and compassionately.

In order to ensure proper collaborations and synergy going forward, the meeting agreed meet regularly to address matters of common interest

The G20 Tourism Ministers











he MEC for Economic Development and Tourism, Ms. Jesta Sidell held a Press briefing to outline planned activities to celebrate the 2025 Tourism Month and to provide an update on preparations to host the much anticipated G20 Tourism Working Group and Tourism Ministers' Meetings. The MEC also used the media briefing to give a detailed report on the interventions currently underway to address the challenges facing tourism attractions sites managed by the Mpumalanga Tourism and Parks Agency, across the panorama route.

Tourism Month is an annual celebration held in September to focus on the importance of tourism to the country's economy. Tourism Month is also celebrated by member countries of the United Nation World Tourism Organization (UNWTO), and South Africa as a member of the UNWTO, celebrates the World Tourism Day to create awareness of tourism's social, cultural, political and economic value, and how the sector can contribute towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals. The Media Briefing, therefore, marked the beginning of the 2025 tourism month, and was held at the Botanical Gardens Restaurant on 01 September 2025.

Appoints Mpumalanga Tou Interim Board Governance Issu

he MEC for Economic Development and Tourism, Ms. Jesta Sidell, has in terms of section 7(4) of the Mpumalanga Tourism and Parks Agency Act, 2005 (Act No. 5 of 2005), appointed an interim Board to oversee governance issues of the Mpumalanga Tourism and Parks Agency (MTPA). Recognising the pivotal role that MTPA plays in stimulating economic growth and job creation, MEC Sidell has prioritised the swift appointment of an interim Board comprising of men and women who possess the necessary expertise and experience to manage the affairs of the entity.

The MEC appointed the interim Board, which will be led by the former Deputy Minister of Tourism, Mr. Fish Mahlalela following the expiry of the term of office of the previous MTPA board on

31 August 2025, to manage the affairs of the Entity until a permanent Board is appointed.
